Here is a lesson on how to form the present continuous tense

Verbs have different forms, called tenses. These tenses of a verb tell us when the action occurs.
We use the present continuous tense to describe actions that are happening at this moment and in the future. The present continuous tense is also referred to as the present progressive tense.

We can form the present continuous tense this way:

am/is/are + verb + ing = present continuous tense

verb + ing = present participle

Here are some examples:

I am learning how to drive.

He is reading a book.

So when do we use the present continuous tense?

We use the present continuous tense in these situations.

Actions that are happening at this moment.

Actions that are happening about now or may be temporary.

And actions that are happening in the future.

So let's take a look at the first one.

Actions that are happening at this moment.

Justin is writing a song.

We are talking too loudly.

They are drawing pictures.



Actions that are happening about now or may be temporary:

She is staying in San Francisco.

We are working very hard these days.

In the future:

We are going camping next week.

I am starting guitar lessons soon.

We are watching the game this evening.
